The first feature length animated film was Walt Disney's 'Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs' in 1927 - the first film made entirely for children.



The first 'talkie' film was 'The Jazz Singer' in 1927. Before this films were 'silent' and had no synchronised sound except for the pianist in the cinema. Charlie Chaplin and Buster Keaton were the stars of silent movies.
